This 65-foot boat has an unforgettable venue. With two decks, an open-air upper deck and enclosed lower deck, there was plenty of seating for everyone. It also included restrooms and a bar with snacks we could purchase. As we cruised around the lake, Captain Dick gave us some commentary about the things we were seeing. At one point another boat came up beside us, waving and honking. It was another GSA who knew all about our planned cruise! gazebo. Lucy came in and gave us a brief talk about the history of the Inn and all the things they do. They host a lot of weddings and other events with many rooms to accommodate them. They also frequently have a big tent set up in the back for even larger groups.



Lunch consisted of a tasty green salad, and our choice of sandwich, potato salad, coffee and tea. It was topped it off with a coconut banana tiramisu for dessert. Very yummy! There were a lot of folks licking their lips and raving about it afterwards.
