Twenty-five Granite State Ambassadors spent a wonderful afternoon having a delicious lunch at the [110 Grill in Nashua](#) socializing and feasting on their contemporary menu.

Hidden off exit 8 of the Everett Highway (101A) in Nashua near the Somerset Plaza Market Basket, 110 Grill is a break away from the typical chain restaurants featuring contemporary casual dining in a modern setting. The restaurant is very airy and bright and has an outdoor seating area with a fire pit and offers music on some evenings.



They seated us in a back area that can be used as part of the restaurant. This room is available for a private party of up to 40 people with a sliding glass door that can close for privacy when needed.

The menu has a lot of variety so I took this opportunity to poll what folks had and how everything was. The consensus was very positive. I enjoyed a Cobb salad, which was done very well. One GSA said the creamy tomato soup was excellent, the best she has had. The turkey burger looked wonderful and was very delicious. A GSA at my table had a salmon sandwich; two others had a Thai style shrimp and noodle dish with sriracha sauce on the

side. They were all very pleased.

Our 2 servers, Brad and Tim, were excellent, efficient and friendly. It can be hard to accommodate a big group at once and they handled it with ease, along with the help from an obviously well run kitchen.

After our food was served, Bob, the General Manager, came to talk to us and answer questions. The first 110 Grill opened in Chelmsford less than 2 years ago. The Nashua location was opened in December of 2014 and named Hippo's Best New Eatery in Nashua for 2015. It was also listed in the top 10 Outdoor Eating Places. He told us how they really focus on using fresh ingredients and everything is made to order. They are very willing to adjust to tastes and allergy restrictions. On the menu, there is a section for vegetarian selections, something we do have guests ask about. In addition they adjust their menu seasonally so it can vary depending on when you visit.



We had a delightful time and came away with a new place to recommend. One note when sending folks their way is that a lot of people's GPS did not do a good job getting them to the restaurant. It's best to look at their website or another map as it is really not hard to find. They are open 7 days a week, for lunch and dinner. For more information, check out their web site.
