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BLOG: WEIRS BEACH TOUR

Our first stop was to the Grand View Motel and Cottages just a short drive past the main Weirs Beach parking area. Easy to find and offering a real nice view of the lake from their elevated location.

The motel began operations way back in 1850 and, while having several owners since that time, has remained a constant place for 'Quiet Comfortable Rooms by the Day or Week'. While the rooms did indeed look comfortable, many people I think would enjoy the view more. Looking out over the lake from a hillside above it, offers you quite view.

The current owners, Tom and Lynda Pucci are the second generation of Pucci's to own the Grand View Motel and Cottages, having taken over from Tom's parents when they retired back in 2004. While the place has remained much the same, upgrades have taken place including HD TV's in the rooms (on vacation who needs them?), WiFi, a Facebook Page, and both Instagram for photo's and a topical 'Blog' to keep guests and potential visitors up to date on the local happenings. You almost can't run a business these day without a presence on social media.



From the Grand View we walked (yet another reason to pick the Grand View) to

Kellerhaus Homemade Candies and Gifts where we split into a couple of smaller groups. One group headed



to the homemade ice cream to make Sundaes smothered with their homemade toppings while the group I was with headed downstairs to watch, and help, make some Chocolate Pecan Clusters. Who knew it was so easy to make? Well, easy IF you are a pro at tempering chocolate and have the right equipment that is. Our part included taking a spoon, filling it with the melted mixture and carefully placing it onto the wax paper. While not everybody took a turn at making a piece, those of us that did came up with a variety of sizes and shapes, with some of us going so far as to add just a bit more Chocolate to the piece we had already placed.

The two groups then sort of swapped places so those of us who had worked could enjoy a Sundae and those that had already had the Sundae could get the chance to make some candy. A fair swap I think.

We then wandered about the gift shop where you could buy just about anything. The popular item was the candy but they did offer so much more.

Then we took off to Proctor's Lakehouse Cottages for a brief history of the cottages & suites and a tour of several of them.



Proctor's Lakehouse Cottages offers a beach front location on Paugus Bay of Lake Winnipesaukee so you can get into the water to cool off on those steamy summer days and also a place to tie up your boat so you have easy access to the rest of the lake. Proctor's is a bit different as

they have a kitchenette in each of their rooms - if you don't want to eat out every day of your stay, you don't have to. They, like the Grand View, are so close to the center of Weir's Beach that you can walk, rather then

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drive your car and hope to find a place to park. These rooms also looked very comfortable and the location is easy to find.

One item that I thought was a bit strange at first is that you need to call either the Grand View or Proctor's Lakehouse Cottages to

make a reservation! While many places allow you to book a room online, these places want to talk with you to make sure you get just what you are looking for so you know, before you arrive, what to look forward to. After hearing the reason explained, I fully understood the reasoning.

We then headed over to the MS Mount Washington for a tour of both the Pilots office and the engine room, two places most passengers never get to visit. While you can peek into the Pilots office, seeing all of the equipment that they have to make your trip as safe as possible isn't something you can really see from a peek in the window.





Multiple displays showing the contour of the lake, showing other boats, rocks and islands were hanging from the ceiling and three different methods of contacting the engine room to adjust the speed of the boat were also available.

The 'new' engines were just added about 6 years ago and are still in their 'break in' period. Being diesel engines, they take a lot of use before they really get 'broken in'.

We were also given a bit of a history lesson on the ship itself. Did you know it was cut into several pieces and

shipped to the lake then reassembled? Did you know that since that time it was cut into to pieces and had a new section added to the middle of it to make it bigger? Well, now you know!

The tour was wonderful even with the day starting with the rain. We got to see a couple of places to send people looking for a vacation spot in the lakes region, a wonderful place for ice cream and candy as well as a place to spend a few hours touring the lake. All in all, a wonderful day!
